# FOREWORD

All the crochet blocks in this book are based on flowers, although some are more realistic than others.

Some blocks are adapted from traditional crochet designs, and use familiar techniques. In general, these are more abstract, less realistic. Many are quite simple to work, and use only one or two colors. Try working them in different color combinations, chosen to suit the purpose you have in mind.

On the other hand, most of the more complicated blocks have been especially designed for this book. These attempt to express the colors and shapes of particular flowers, using combinations of different stitches and unusual constructions to form the different flower parts. As a rule, the flower color(s) will be dictated, more or less, by the featured flower, but the background colors can be varied in any way you choose.

As a keen gardener, I love watching the seasons and the different flowers they bring, so I relished the challenge of choosing and designing the blocks for this book. In the garden, my favorite flower is always the one due to bloom in a week or two; when working on this book, my favorite block was always the one I had in mind to make next!

# ABOUT THIS BOOK

This book provides a delightful collection of over 75 floral blocks to crochet. Each is both charming in its own right and looks fantastic when worked with others to create throws, cushions, scarves, or other projects of your own devising.

As well as covering basics such as equipment, yarn, abbreviations, and symbols, this chapter also contains techniques for using the blocks in this book, such as block arrangement, joining blocks, edgings, and planning a project.



## SIZE

Blocks of the same shape are all the same size, for easy mixing and matching. All of the blocks in the Directory were worked using double knitting (DK) weight yarn and size E (3.5 mm) hook. They measure as follows:

- Triangle: 6 in (15 cm)
- Square: 5½ in (14 cm)
- Diamond: 5½ x 7 in (14 x 18 cm)
- Hexagon: 5 in (13 cm)
- Circle: 5½ in (14 cm)

## USEFUL TECHNIQUES

# MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT

The basic tools for crochet are simple, portable, and relatively inexpensive.

## HOOKS

Crochet hooks are the most important tools in your collection. Good quality crochet hooks are smooth and free of snags, and feel comfortable in your hand.

Crochet hooks are available in a range of materials, such as aluminum, bamboo, plastic, and resin. Aluminum hooks work well with woolly and fuzzy yarns, whereas bamboo hooks can help to control smooth, slippery yarns. Sometimes changing from, say, a plastic hook to a bamboo hook can affect the size of your finished block; always check your gauge carefully (page 12). Hooks are also made in different styles, such as with a flattened thumb rest, or (for small metal hooks) a wider wooden or plastic handle. Try out the different styles to see which suits you best.

As a rule, the finer the yarn, the smaller the suitable hook. The size of hook you use, together with the type of yarn chosen, will affect the finished size of the blocks you make (see pages 12–13).

This table shows both the American system of hook sizing and the international metric system, although the two systems do not correspond exactly. Even smaller hooks are available for very fine crochet threads.

## USEFUL TIP

Where a yarn label gives a recommended metric knitting needle size, a crochet hook of a similar metric size will usually give a satisfactory result.

## ACCESSORIES

It is useful to keep a few other items in your work bag.

### YARN NEEDLES

These are used for sewing seams and for darning yarn tails (1). Yarn needles have blunt tips, to avoid splitting stitches. They are available in different sizes. Choose a yarn needle to suit the weight of your yarn. The eye should be large enough to easily take the yarn you are using.

### PINS

Glass-headed pins (2) have large heads, and are the best type to use for blocking (page 10). Safety pins are useful when joining blocks together, to enable you to match the stitches and corners exactly.

### SCISSORS

Use a pair of small, sharp scissors to cut yarn cleanly (3).

### RULER AND TAPE MEASURE

A small ruler is best for checking the size of your blocks to obtain the gauge you want (see page 12). A tape measure is useful for larger measurements (4).

### STITCH MARKERS

Use this type of split marker (5) to hold the working loop when you put your work aside, or when you leave a color aside that you will later return to. Markers can also be used as an aid to counting, for example when working a long edging.






The swatches above show the blocks at real size and demonstrate how yarn and hook size can dramatically change the appearance and feel of the same design.

## YARNS AND BLOCK SIZES

The weight of yarn you choose (together with the hook size) will dictate the finished size of the block you make.

The Off-center square (block 37, page 90) is shown here made in six different weights of yarn, each worked with the corresponding suitable size of hook (see table on page 10).

It is possible to change the size of a block slightly, by using a hook one or two sizes smaller or larger than recommended. However, this will affect the feel of the finished block, using a smaller hook makes a firmer block (which may be fine for a purse, perhaps, but unsuitable for a shawl), while using a larger hook will make a looser block, which may not keep its shape in use.






## TO TEST YOUR GAUGE

Always test your own gauge before starting any project.

- 1 Make a block with the yarn you want to use and a suitable hook (see table on page 10) and press or block the work (see page 20).
- 2 Measure the block across the center with a small ruler (for a triangular block, measure the length of the sides).
- 3 If your block is too small, try again with a larger hook. If your block is too large, make another with a smaller hook.

# ABBREVIATIONS AND SYMBOLS

There is no worldwide standard for crochet abbreviations and symbols, but below is a list of those used in this book.



## ARRANGEMENTS OF SYMBOLS



### SYMBOLS JOINED AT TOP

A group of symbols may be joined at the top, indicating that these stitches should be worked together at the top.



### SYMBOLS JOINED AT BASE

Symbols joined at the base should all be worked into the same stitch below.



### SYMBOLS JOINED AT TOP AND BASE

Sometimes a group of stitches are joined at both top and bottom, making a puff, bobble, or popcorn.



### SYMBOLS ON A CURVE

Sometimes symbols are drawn at an angle, depending on the construction of the stitch pattern.




### DISTORTED SYMBOLS

Some symbols may be lengthened, curved, or spiked, to indicate where the hook is inserted below.


## READING CHARTS





## BALL BANDS

Most yarns have a paper band or tag attached with vital information such as the weight of the ball or skein, fiber composition, yardage, and how to look after your finished item. The band may also recommend hook and knitting needle sizes and give gauge details.






## DIRECTIONS OF WORKING

Crochet can be worked in rows or in rounds. The method of working for each block in this book is indicated in the instructions.

### ROWS OR ROUNDS

Blocks worked in rows are worked back and forth. As a rule, each row begins with a number of turning chains, which count as the first stitch of the row: 1 ch = 1 sc, 2 ch = 1 hdc, 3 ch = 1 dc, and so on. On the following row, the last stitch is worked into the top of the turning chains.

Blocks worked in the round are worked outward from the center in a counterclockwise direction. Each round normally begins with a number of starting chains (the equivalent of the turning chains used when working in rows), and each round closes with a slip stitch worked into the top of these chains. The starting chain(s) at the beginning of a round, together with the slip stitch at the end, are counted as the first stitch of the round.

Some blocks are worked in both rows and rounds, for example the Dandelion diamond (block 40, page 93), which consists of a central panel worked in rows, with an outer border worked in rounds.


Some blocks begin with the length of two edges, and stitches are decreased at the center on every row, ending at the top corner

### WORKING IN THE ROUND


Blocks worked in the round begin at the center with either a fingerwrap or a ring of chains.

#### FINGERWRAP

This method closes the center tightly, leaving no hole unless a large number of stitches are worked on the first round.



Sometimes called a slip ring, a fingerwrap is made by winding the yarn once or twice around a finger (or thumb), then using the hook to pull through a loop from the ball end of the yarn. Do not pull tight.



Hold the wrap flat between finger and thumb and work the starting chain(s), then work the required stitches into the wrap, working over the starting tail at the same time to enclose it. Then pull the starting tail gently to close the ring, and join with a slip stitch into the last of the starting chains.


### UNDERSTANDING ROUNDS

When working in rounds, the work is not turned, so the right side is always facing you. The stitches of the previous round face in the same direction as the stitches you are working, so the top of each stitch is always to the RIGHT of its stem.




## RING OF CHAINS

This method leaves a small hole at the center of the block, the size depending on the number of chains in the ring.





Work the required number of chains, then join into a circle with a slip stitch in the first chain made.



For each round, work the number of chains to stand for the first stitch, then work the required stitches into the center of the ring (not into the individual chains). You can work over the starting tail at the same time, to enclose it. Close the ring with a slip stitch in the top of the starting chains. Pull gently on the starting tail to neaten the center, and trim off the excess.

## FINISHING NEATLY


Always finish off each block securely; think ahead, and leave a long tail where it will be useful for sewing a seam. Where the edges of blocks will be hidden in a seam, simply work 1 chain, cut the yarn, and pull the tail through the last stitch. Where the edge will be visible in use, try this technique for a perfect finish:



Do not work the final slip stitch of the last round. Cut the yarn leaving a 4 in (10 cm) tail and thread this into a yarn needle. Pass the needle under the top of the first stitch of the round as shown, and back through the last stitch. Darn in the tail on the wrong side.

## DARNING IN TAILS

Tails not enclosed during working a block may be darned in on the wrong side after completion. Use a yarn needle, and always darn in for at least 2 in (5 cm) to prevent the tail from slipping out again. For smooth, slippery yarns, reverse the direction and darn back again for a few stitches. Trim off the excess.




On lacy blocks, darn in the tails along the back of the stitches for about 2 in (5 cm), changing direction to suit the pattern, so that the tail will not show on the right side.

# BLOCK ARRANGEMENTS

Squares, diamonds, triangles, hexagons, and circles can be joined together in several different arrangements.


## SQUARES

Join squares into strips, then join the strips.




## HEXAGONS

Join hexagons into strips, then join the strips.



## DIAMONDS

Join diamonds into diagonally slanting strips, then join the strips.



Alternatively, arrange blocks into sloping strips, then join the strips.



## TRIANGLES

Strips of triangles can be joined in two ways, as shown.




Six triangles can be joined to make a hexagon.





## CIRCLES

Circles may be fitted quite closely together, by joining just a few stitches at six points around each circle; join each circle in place in turn. The resulting gaps between the circles will be quite small.




Circles may also be joined into strips, and the strips joined together. The resulting gaps may be filled with small connector pieces, such as squares or circles formed by working the first one or two rounds of suitable blocks.



These Dahlia circles (block 70, page 123) are joined using the joining with picots method (page 21), with a connector piece made by working rounds 1 and 2 of the Butterfly circle (block 73, page 126).

Other suitable connectors may be contrived by working the first one or two rounds of many of the blocks in this book, including round 1 of the Coral trellis square (gray sample, block 16, page 69) and rounds 1 and 2 of the Blossom square (jade sample, block 17, page 70).




## JOINING BLOCKS

Blocks can be joined with sewn seams or crochet seams. Blocks made with picots on the last round are usually joined together as they are worked. All the blocks of the same shape in this book are of similar size, so that all the squares may be fitted together, or all the triangles, or all the diamonds, and so on.


### BLOCKING

Blocking your crochet pieces before joining them together will improve the neatness of the stitches and help the blocks to retain their shape. To retain the texture of crochet blocks, cold water blocking is recommended. Blocks made with picots on the last round can be blocked after joining together.



A blocking board is a small board (plywood or fiberboard) covered with a layer of batting and a layer of cotton fabric, which is pulled tight, folded over the edges, and stapled at the back. Checkered or gingham fabric provides a useful guide for square blocks.

- 1 Lay the blocks flat with right sides facing up.
- 2 To block, check the measurements with a ruler as you insert pins, gently easing the blocks into shape. Pin with large-headed pins at right angles to the edges, all around the edge of each block. Use as many pins as you need to hold the edges straight.
- 3 Use a spray bottle to mist the blocks thoroughly with cold water. Pat them gently to dampen all the stitches.
- 4 Allow to dry completely before removing the pins.




### SLIP STITCH SEAM

This firm seam is suitable for joining blocks worked in any direction. Working on the wrong side in matching yarn gives a neat appearance on the right side.

- 1 Place the two blocks right sides together.
- 2 Use a hook one size smaller than used for the blocks and (if possible) matching yarn. Insert the hook through both layers. On top/bottom edges, insert through matching stitches; on side edges, insert either one whole stitch in from each edge, or through the center of the first stitch of each layer. Pull through a loop of yarn.
- 3 Continue in slip stitch through both layers together.

**When joining side edges of blocks worked in rows,** try out a short length of seam to find a suitable spacing for the stitches. For example, when joining rows of double crochet, 2 slip stitches per row usually gives a neat result.

**When working a zigzag seam** (such as when joining hexagons), work 1 or 2 chains at each corner, so that the seam is not too tight.



### SINGLE CROCHET SEAM

This seam is suitable for joining blocks worked in any direction. It may be worked on the wrong side, or on the right side as a decorative feature. When joining blocks of different colors, the seams may be worked all in one contrasting color for a unifying effect (see *Busy Lizzie* throw, pages 134–135).

- 1 Place the blocks right (or wrong) sides together.
- 2 Use a hook one size smaller than used for the blocks, and matching or contrasting yarn. Insert the hook through both layers—either through matching stitches, or through matching row ends—and pull through a loop.
- 3 Continue in single crochet through both layers together, joining each pair of stitches with 1 single crochet.


**On side edges,** try out a short length to find a suitable spacing, as for slip stitch seam.

**At the corners of a zigzag seam,** work 1 or 2 extra single crochet into the chain spaces of the intersection.

**Neaten your yarn tails** of any color by enclosing them as you work this seam.

## JOINING WITH PICOTS


Some blocks are worked with picots on the outer edges, which are designed to be joined together as work progresses. The blocks are only joined where corresponding picots meet, giving an open, lacy effect.



## FLAT SEWN SEAM


This seam is particularly suitable for blocks worked in the round, where the outer edges consist entirely of the tops of stitches. As you finish each block, you can leave a long yarn tail to use for seaming, thereby avoiding extra yarn tails to darn in.

- 1 Place the blocks on a flat surface with wrong sides (or right sides, if preferred) facing up.
  - 2 Using a yarn needle, secure the yarn at the right (or use the tail from the block).
  - 3 Link the two edges together as shown by passing the needle away from you, under one thread from each edge, then toward you, again under one thread from each edge. Do not pull too tightly.
- At the end of the seam, secure with a small backstitch, and darn in the tail.
  - A similar seam may be worked to join the side edges of blocks worked in rows. Pass the needle under just one thread of the outermost stitch of each layer.



- 1 Work the first block as given in the instructions.
- 2 Then work the second block as far as the first picot to be joined, and work to the central chain of the picot—for example, on a 5-ch picot, work 2 ch.
- 3 With right side of first block facing up, insert the hook from below, through the center of the corresponding picot, and work a slip stitch, which counts as 1 chain (see diagram, left).
- 4 Complete the picot, then continue the final round of the second block to the next picot to be joined.
- 5 Repeat steps 3 and 4 as required, then complete the final round of the second block, and fasten off.

Where several blocks meet together, insert the hook into the picot diagonally opposite (see photo, below).



## EDGINGS

There are two methods of adding an edging to your work: grown-on edgings and sewn-on borders.

### GROWN-ON EDGINGS


Grown-on edgings are worked directly on the edge of the crochet, and almost always begin with a row or round of single crochet, as below. For a neat, firm result, use a hook one size smaller than used for the blocks.

When working on a large project, it is advisable to try out a short length of edging, including a corner or two, to make sure the edging lies flat. If the edging is wavy, there are too many stitches, but if it curls inward, there are too few.

See page 24 for three grown-on edging samples.

### GROWN-ON SINGLE CROCHET BORDER

See the border used for the Busy Lizzie throw (pages 134–135), which is worked in rounds of single crochet, increasing at outer corners and decreasing at inward corners, with the final round in reverse rope stitch edging.




### SINGLE CROCHET ON AN OUTER, TOP, OR BOTTOM EDGE

On the outer edge of a block worked in the round, or on the top edge of a block worked in rows, work 1 sc into each stitch as shown. On the lower edge of a block worked in rows, work 1 sc in the base of each stitch.

On the outer edge of a circle, you may need to increase a few stitches to keep the edge flat—about 8 sts for a full circle.

Where an edge includes chain spaces, try working 1 sc into the space for each chain; you may need to adjust the number slightly.



### SINGLE CROCHET ON A SIDE EDGE


On a side edge of a block worked in rows, insert the hook under two threads of the first (or last) stitch of each row, and try out a short length to test the number of stitches required for a flat result, according to these guidelines:


**Rows of sc:** 1 sc in side edge of each row.

**Rows of hdc:** 3 sc in side edge of every 2 rows

**Rows of dc:** 2 sc in side edge of every row.

**Rows of tr:** 3 sc in side edge of each row.






### SINGLE CROCHET AT INWARD CORNERS

At inward corners, it is necessary to decrease on every round to keep the edge flat.

**At a right angle:** Decrease by 2 sc on every round, by working 3 sc tog, with the central insertion exactly in the corner. On subsequent rounds, work 3 sc tog, with the central insertion in the previous 3 sc tog, or work 2 sc tog, inserting the hook in the sc before and after the previous decrease.

**At a wide angle:** Decrease by 2 sc as for a right angle, but not on every round.

**At a sharp angle:** Decrease by 4 sc, working 3 sc tog at either side of the corner, on every round or every second or third round, as required.



### SINGLE CROCHET AT OUTER CORNERS

At outer corners of a square, increase by working 3 sc, or [1 sc, 1 ch, 1 sc], in the same place on every round.

The outer corners of other shapes are not right angles, so if you want a wide border all in single crochet, you may need to experiment:


**At the corners of a triangle:** 5 sc, or [1 sc, 3 ch, 1 sc], or [2 sc, 1 ch, 2 sc].

**At the corners of a hexagon:** 3 sc on the first round. If worked on every round, this will make a slightly wavy edge, so for a wide border work every second or third round with no increasing.

**At the corners of a diamond:** Work the sharp top and bottom corners as for a triangle, and the other corners as for a square.

## SEWN-ON BORDERS

These are normally worked sideways—that is, beginning with a short side—and to the length required. The length can then be adjusted to fit exactly when the border is sewn in place. See page 25 for three sewn-on border samples.



### FITTING A SEWN-ON BORDER

Work the border to the length you think you need, and slip the working loop onto a split marker to prevent unraveling. Pin the border in place with safety pins. Butt the two edges together and join with a flat sewn seam (or a crochet seam if you prefer). This knotted loop edging (page 25) fits easily around corners, but if necessary, gather the border slightly at outer corners, so it is not stretched. Before you seam the last few inches, adjust the length to fit exactly. Join the two ends of the border with a flat sewn seam.

## SMALL PICOT EDGING


This edging is worked lengthwise, usually as the final row of a single crochet border.

With right side of work facing, work a few rows or rounds of single crochet (2 rows shown on chart).

**Small picot row (chart row 3):** 1 ch, skip first sc, \* 3 ch, ss in first of these 3 ch, skip 1 sc, 1 sc in next sc, \* repeat from \* to \* to end, working last sc in 1 ch. Fasten off. To complete a round, ss in first ch.

### Notes:

- At outer corners, try working [3 ch, ss in first of these 3 ch, 1 sc in next sc] twice, exactly at the corner, to enable the edging to lie flat.
- At inward corners, work 2 (or 3) sc tog exactly at the corner.
- If working in rounds, any number of rounds of sc may precede the Small picot row.

## PLAIN RUFFLE

This edging is worked lengthwise, and may begin with any number of stitches.


With right side of work facing, work 1 row or round of single crochet (1 row shown on chart).

**Row 2:** 1 ch, 1 sc in first sc, 2 sc in each sc, ending 2 sc in 1 ch.

**Row 3:** As row 2. Fasten off.

### Notes:

- This edging may also be worked in rounds, increasing on each round in the same way.
- For a wider, looser ruffle work rows 2 and 3 in dc or tr. For a tighter ruffle, repeat row 3 once more.
- At outer corners, work 3 sc in the same place on the first 2 rows of sc. At inward corners, work 3 sc tog on the first 2 rows of sc (see page 23).

## BLOCK EDGING


Worked lengthwise, this bold edging is quick and simple to work.

With right side of work facing, begin at right and work a few rows or rounds of single crochet (2 rows shown on chart).


**Block row (chart row 3):** 3 ch, skip 3 sc, \* 1 dc in next sc, 3 ch, 4 dc in sp behind dc just made, skip 3 sc, \* repeat from \* to \* to last sc, 3 ch, ss in last st. Fasten off. If working in rounds, end with 1 block of 3 dc, ss in first dc of round.

### Notes:

- At outer corners, adjust the number of sc so that each edge has a multiple of 4 sts, plus 1—the extra st should be the center st of 3 at each corner (see page 23). On Block row, work 1 dc (carrying a block) into the center sc of 3 at each corner.
- To work in rounds, work 2 or more rounds of sc, ending with a multiple of 4 sts. Work 3<sup>rd</sup> round as Block row, ending 1 dc in base of 3 ch at beg of round, 4 dc in sp behind dc just made. Fasten off.

## FRILLED FLOWERS

This edging is worked sideways and sewn in place.

Make 5 ch, join into a ring with ss in first ch.

**Row 1:** 3 ch, 7 dc into ring, turn.

**Row 2:** 3 ch, skip first dc, \* [1 sc in next dc, 3 ch] 3 times, 1 sc in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch, 9 ch, ss in 5<sup>th</sup> ch from hook (making another ring), turn.


**Row 3:** 3 ch, 7 dc into ring, 1 ch, ss in last 3-ch loop of previous repeat, turn.

**Row 4:** 1 ch, work as row 2 from \* to end.

Repeat rows 3 and 4 to required length, ending row 4 by omitting the final 9 ch and ss.

### Notes:

- At outer corners, arrange the edging so that a corner between 2 repeats falls exactly at the corner.
- At inward corners, work 14 ch instead of 9 ch on row 4, so that one repeat can be placed on either side of the corner.

## DOUBLE SHELLS

Worked sideways, this edging is worked separately and sewn in place.

**Row 1:** 4 ch, 1 dc in first ch made, (1 ring made)

**Row 2:** 3 ch, [2 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc] into ring (1 double shell made), turn.

**Row 3:** 5 ch, \* [ss, 3 ch, 1 dc] into 2-ch sp at top of double shell (1 ring made), turn.

**Row 4:** 3 ch, [2 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc] into ring, 1 dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 5 ch at beg of previous row, turn.

Repeat rows 3 and 4 to length required.



### Notes:

- At outer corners, work to length required, ending with row 4.

**Next row:** 3 ch, work as row 3 from \* to end.

**Full row:** As row 4, ending ss in dc at base of 3 ch, turn. Continue in pattern, beginning with row 3.

## KNOTTED LOOPS

Worked sideways, this edging is worked separately and sewn in place. It fits easily around corners.

### Special abbreviation

**PS (puff stitch):** [Yrh, insert as given, pull through a loop] 3 times in same place, yrh, pull through first 6 loops on hook, yrh, pull through remaining 2 loops on hook.


**Row 1:** 13 ch, PS in first ch made. Do not turn the work.

**Row 2:** 12 ch, PS in top of previous PS (inserting the hook under two threads), do not turn.


Repeat row 2 to length required. Fasten off.

The length of the fringe may be adjusted by working more or fewer chains.

# PLANNING A PROJECT

Your starting point for a project may be a favorite block, an exciting color combination, a new yarn you want to try out, or a gift needed for a special occasion. Whatever your inspiration, there are several factors to take into account when planning a project: the block(s), the yarn, the colors, the arrangement, and the method of construction. Follow these guidelines for a successful result.

## CHOOSE THE BLOCK(S)

Crochet fabric can be smooth, lacy, or textured, depending on which technique you are using.

Consider the use of the finished item to help you choose a suitable block, for example:

**A winter scarf** may be lacy or quite solid, but the wrong side of the blocks will be visible in wear. The wrong sides of some blocks are similar in appearance to the right sides, while others may differ considerably.

**A blanket** for a new baby should not be too lacy, as tiny fingers can become trapped in the holes.


**A shopping bag** requires sturdy blocks, without large holes (unless you choose to add a lining).



Smooth blocks are solid and have greater strength than lacy or textured blocks. Interest can be added by using different colors and motifs.



Lacy blocks work well when they are combined with each other, but they can also be used to add a touch of lightness to other block combinations.



Textured blocks add surface interest and three-dimensionality to designs.

## CHOOSE THE YARN

Consider the properties you need for the project you are planning in order to choose your yarn, for example:


**For a winter scarf**, a warm, light, soft yarn might be your choice, such as merino wool or angora blends.

**For a lacy wrap**, a smooth, satiny yarn such as glazed cotton, viscose, or silk will drape well and show off the stitch textures.

**For a baby blanket**, a machine-washable yarn is a practical choice.

**For a shopping bag**, a strong, hard-wearing yarn is required, such as cotton or cotton/synthetic blends.

Also consider the weight of the yarn. This will affect the size of blocks you make (see pages 12–13), which in turn will affect the finished design: bold and chunky, or light and delicate.



## COLOR WHEEL

You can use an artist's color wheel to help you choose colors that go together.

The color wheel is made of three primary colors (1): red, blue, and yellow. These are mixed in pairs to create the secondary colors: (2) purple, green, and orange. These in turn are mixed with their neighbors to create tertiary colors (3).

Opposite colors on the wheel (such as green and red) are "complementary" colors.

Adjacent colors on the wheel are harmonious—for example, blue, turquoise, and green.

## CHOOSE THE COLORS

Color choice is ultimately a matter of personal taste, but may also be influenced by the nature of the project:

**For accessories,** match or contrast colors for scarves, wraps, purses, or bags to coordinate with your wardrobe.


**For a pillow or throw,** choose colors to suit the color scheme of a room—either subtly blending with the scheme, or brightly contrasting, to provide an exciting focal point.

You may come across a color combination you really like perhaps in a fabric print or a picture.

You can take photographs, or keep a sketchbook or scrapbook, for future reference.


### WARM COLORS

Colors on the orange side of the color wheel, from yellow through red, are warm colors. Choose these for bright, cheerful impact.



### COOL COLORS

Cool colors are those on the blue side of the color wheel, from lilac through green. These colors have a calming effect.



### COMPLEMENTARY COLORS

Used together, complementary colors create vibrant, contrasting combinations. Choose slightly softened shades for a rich, rather than clashing, result.



### HARMONIOUS COLORS

Harmonious colors can be used to enhance one another. Adding a neutral can bring out the subtle differences in hue.



### TEST STRIPS

Use yarn from your stash (or buy small skeins of tapestry wool) to try out color combinations. Wind yarns around a strip of cardboard and secure with adhesive tape. The proportions of the stripes can be varied, as well as the colors. Such a strip can then be used as a shopping guide when purchasing yarn.




## CHOOSE THE ARRANGEMENT

The blocks in this book can be combined in many different ways. Some of the basic arrangements are shown on pages 18–19.


All the blocks of the same shape in this book are of similar size—that is, all the squares may be fitted together, or all the triangles, or all the diamonds, and so on. The mix and matches dotted throughout the book are just some of the ways in which the blocks can be combined and are designed to inspire you to create your own arrangements.

Always make sample blocks to try out the yarns and colors you have chosen, to make sure you are happy with the result. Also note down the hook size used for each block. Block each sample as on page 20.




### DESIGN TIP



With the aid of a photocopier and a camera, you can quickly try out different arrangements by photocopying sample blocks and arranging the copies in different ways. You can then photograph the different arrangements and decide what works best.



You can choose two or more block designs of the same shape and put them together in various arrangements.




Some blocks feature directional rather than symmetrical designs. These blocks may be arranged in various ways to make larger patterns.



You can make the same block in more than one color combination, and arrange them to make larger patterns, such as these zigzag stripes formed with diamonds. See also the Busy Lizzie throw on pages 134–135.

## PLAN THE CONSTRUCTION

- 1 Measure your sample block(s) as page on 12.
- 2 Decide on the finished size of the project and the size of each section (such as front, back, and side/base panels of a bag).
- 3 Draw a plan of the arrangement—graph paper is useful for this.
- 4 Count how many blocks will you need for each section.
- 5 Decide on the order in which you will make the blocks, how you will join them (see pages 20–21) and any edging required (see pages 22–25).



## LOOKING AFTER CROCHET

Always clean crochet regularly, according to the care instructions on the ball band of the yarns you have used. You may prefer to have large throws and afghans professionally dry-cleaned.

To store articles not in use, never enclose them in a plastic bag, as the fibers will not be able to breathe and the static cling created by polythene will attract dust and dirt. Instead, wrap in a clean cotton pillowcase or sheet, depending on size. Store in a dry, cool, dust-free place, adding a bag of dried lavender to keep the crochet smelling sweet and to deter moths.



## CALCULATE THE YARN REQUIRED

The most accurate way to calculate the yarn you will need for a large project is to make a block, unravel it, and measure the length of each color used. You can then use the yardage given on the yarn ball band to estimate how many balls of each color will be required for the number of blocks you want. Repeat for each design of block you intend to use.

To calculate the amount of yarn required for an edging (especially on a large article, such as a

throw), work a short length of edging over, say, three or four blocks, unravel it, and measure the length of yarn used. You can then estimate how much will be required for the whole edging.

Be generous when estimating the total for each color—it's better to have yarn left over than to need another ball, and find you can't buy the matching dye lot.

**Round 3:** 3 ch, \* [2 dc, 1 ch, 2 dc] in next 3-ch sp, 2 ch, 1 sc in next dc, 2 ch, [3 dc, 1 ch, 3 dc] in 5-ch sp, 2 ch, # 1 sc in next dc, 2 ch, \* rep from \* to \* once more, then once again from \* to #, ss in first of 3 ch. 6 petals: 3 small, 3 large. Fasten off B. Join C to 1-ch sp at center of any small petal.

**Round 4:** 6 ch, 1 dc in same place, \* 7 ch, 1 sc in 1-ch sp at center of next (large) petal, 7 ch, # [1 dc, 3 ch, 1 dc] in 1-ch sp at center of next (small) petal, \* rep from \* to \* once more, then once again from \* to #, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 6 ch.

**Round 5:** Ss into 3-ch sp, 6 ch, 2 dc in same place, \* 5 ch, 3 sc in next 5-ch sp, 1 sc in next sc, 3 sc in next 5-ch sp, 5 ch, # [2 dc, 3 ch, 2 dc] in next 3-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* once more, then once again from \* to #, 1 dc in first ch sp, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 6 ch.

**Round 6:** Ss into 3-ch sp, 6 ch, 2 dc in same place, \* 5 ch, 3 sc in next 5-ch sp, 1 sc in each of 7 sc, 3 sc in next 5-ch sp, 5 ch, # [2 dc, 3 ch, 2 dc] in next 3-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* once more, then once again from \* to #, 1 dc in first ch sp, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 6 ch.

**Round 7:** Ss into 3-ch sp, 6 ch, 2 dc in same place, \* 3 ch, 3 sc in 5-ch sp, 1 sc in each of 13 sc, 3 sc in 5-ch sp, 3 ch, # [2 dc, 3 ch, 2 dc] in next 3-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* once more, then once again from \* to #, 1 dc in first ch sp, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 6 ch. Fasten off C.

**Row 8:** In C, 3 ch, 1 dc in first dc, 1 dc in each of next 4 dc chg to B; in B, 1 dc in each of next 5 dc chg to C; in C, 1 dc in each of 4 dc, 2 dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch. 17 sts.


**Row 9:** In C, 3 ch, 1 dc in first dc, 1 dc in each of next 6 dc chg to B; in B, 1 dc in each of next 3 dc chg to C; in C, 1 dc in each of 6 dc, 2 dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch. 19 sts.

**Row 10:** In C, 3 ch, 1 dc in first dc, 1 dc in each of next 8 dc chg to B; in B, 1 dc in next dc chg to C; in C, 1 dc in each of 8 dc, 2 dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch. 21 sts.

Fasten off B. Continue in C.

**Rows 11–13:** As row 3. 25 sts. Fasten off C.

**Round 4:** 3 ch, 2 tr tog over first and 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of 9-ch loop, \* 9 ch, 5 tr tog over [7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> ch of same 9-ch loop, center sc of 3 sc, first and 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of next 9-ch loop], \* rep from \* to \* 4 more times, 9 ch, 2 tr tog over [7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> ch of same 9-ch loop], ss in 2 tr tog.**Round 5:** 4 ch, [1 tr; 1 ch] 5 times in ch closing first 2 tr tog of round 4, ss in 9-ch loop of round 3 (enclosing ch of round 4), \* 1 ch, [1 tr; 1 ch] 6 times in ch closing next 5 tr tog, ss in 9-ch loop of round 3 (enclosing ch of round 4), \* rep from \* to \* 4 more times, 1 ch, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch. 6 flowers complete.

Fasten off A. Join B to center 1-ch sp at top of any flower.

**Round 6:** 2 ch, sk 1 tr; 1 sc in 1-ch sp, \* 5 ch, work 5 sts tog: [1 dc in next 1-ch sp, 1 tr in foll 1-ch sp, 1 dtr in ss between flowers, 1 tr in next 1-ch sp, 1 dc in foll 1-ch sp], 5 ch, # [1 sc in next 1-ch sp, 1 ch, sk 1 tr] twice, 1 sc in next ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* 4 more times, then once again from \* to #, 1 sc in next 1-ch sp, 1 ch, sk 1 tr; ss in first of 2 ch. 96 sts.**Round 7:** 1 ch, 1 sc in 1-ch sp, \* 5 sc in 5-ch sp, 1 sc in 5 sts tog, 5 sc in 5-ch sp, # [1 sc in next sc, 1 sc in 1-ch sp] twice, 1 sc in next sc, \* rep from \* to \* 4 more times, then once again from \* to #, 1 sc in next sc, 1 sc in 1-ch sp, ss in first ch. 96 sc.

Fasten off B.





**Round 1:** 3 ch, 23 dc into wrap, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch.**Round 2:** 3 ch, 1 dc in each of 2 dc, 3 ch, [1 dc in each of 3 dc, 3 ch] 7 times, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch.**Round 3:** 2 ch, 2 dc tog over next 2 dc, [3 ch, 1 dc in 3-ch sp, 3 ch, 3 dc tog over next 3 dc] 7 times, 3 ch, 1 dc in 3-ch sp, 3 ch, ss in first 2 dc tog of round.

Fasten off A. Join B to any 3-ch sp before a single dc.

**Round 4:** 4 ch, [3 dc in next 3-ch sp, 1 ch] 15 times, 2 dc in same ch sp as beg of round, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch.**Round 5:** Ss into 1-ch sp, 4 ch, [4 dc in next 1-ch sp, 1 ch] 15 times, 3 dc in same ch sp as beg of round, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch.**Round 6:** Ss into 1-ch sp, 4 ch, [5 dc in next 1-ch sp, 1 ch] 15 times, 4 dc in same ch sp as beg of round, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch. 96 sts. Fasten off B.

### Special abbreviation

**B (bobble):** 4 dc tog in same place.

Using A, make 4 ch, join into a ring with ss in first ch.

**Round 1:** 4 ch, [1 dc into ring, 1 ch] 7 times, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch. 16 sts.

**Round 2:** 1 ch, [B in next 1-ch sp, 1 ch, 1 sc in next dc] 7 times, B in next 1-ch sp, 1 ch, ss in first ch. 8 bobbles.

**Round 3:** 4 ch, 1 dc in same place as base of these ch, \* 1 ch, sk B and foll ch, [1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc] in next sc, \* rep from \* to \* 6 more times, 1 ch, sk B and foll ch, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch.


**Round 4:** 1 ch, 1 sc in same place, [B in next 1-ch sp, 1 ch, 2 sc in next dc] 15 times, B in next 1-ch sp, ss in first ch. 16 bobbles. Fasten off A. Turn work over and join yarn B to first of any 2 sc. Right side is now facing.


**Round 5:** 4 ch, 1 dc in same place as base of these ch, [1 ch, sk B and foll ch, 1 dc in next sc, 1 ch, 1 dc in next sc] 15 times, 1 ch, sk B and foll ch, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch. 64 sts.

**Round 6:** Ss into 1-ch sp, 4 ch, 1 dc in same sp, \* 2 ch, sk [1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc], [1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc] in next 1-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* 14 more times, 2 ch, sk [1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc], ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch. 80 sts.

**Round 7:** Ss into 1-ch sp, 4 ch, 1 dc in same sp, \* 3 ch, sk [1 dc, 2 ch, 1 dc], [1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc] in 1-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* 14 more times, 3 ch, sk [1 dc, 2 ch, 1 dc], ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 4 ch. 96 sts.

**Round 8:** 1 ch, [1 sc in 1-ch sp, 1 sc in next dc, 3 sc in 3-ch sp, 1 sc in next sc] 15 times, 1 sc in 1-ch sp, 1 sc in next dc, 3 sc in 3-ch sp, ss in first ch. 96 sts. Fasten off yarn B.

## PROJECTS

---

The blocks in this book can be combined and used in a myriad of ways. This chapter presents a selection of stunning designs to inspire you with ideas of how to use the blocks in your own projects.



# BUSY LIZZIE THROW

This arrangement of Busy Lizzie Hexagons (block 55, page 108) is quite simple, but by using six colors in different combinations for the blocks, the effect is rich and satisfying. A single unifying color is used for the seams and border.

- MATERIALS**
- Size: Approx. 42 x 42 in (107 x 107 cm)
- Aran weight wool, 50 g ball = approx. 100 yd (90 m)
- 200 g (4 balls) each of 1st color (copper), 2nd color (dark pink), 3rd color (peach)
  - 150 g (3 balls) each of 4th color (powder blue), 5th color (aqua), 6th color (duck egg)
  - 150 g (3 balls) 7th color (teal) for seams and edging
  - Size H and G (5 and 4 mm) hooks
  - Tapestry needle

**GAUGE**

Busy Lizzie Hexagon (block 55, page 108) worked using size H (5 mm) hook measures 7 in (18 cm) across from corner to corner.

**COLORS AND LAYOUT**

For each block, one of the three warm colors (copper, dark pink, or peach) is used for the central round 1, and a second warm color for rounds 2 and 3; then one of the three cool colors (powder blue, aqua, or duck egg) is used for the outer border, rounds 4 and 5. The six blocks used are numbered 1–6, and colored and arranged as per the table and diagram, right.

**TO MAKE THROW**

Using size H (5 mm) hook and following the instructions for the Busy Lizzie Hexagon (block 55, page

108), work the 45 blocks shown in the diagram, right. You will need the following number of blocks in each color combination (see table below):

- 7 of block 1
- 9 of block 2
- 7 of block 3
- 7 of block 4
- 8 of block 5
- 7 of block 6

**TO MAKE UP**


Arrange the finished blocks as shown in the diagram, right. Using size G (4 mm) hook and 7<sup>th</sup> col. (teal), join the blocks into 7 vertical lines, as shown on diagram, with single crochet seams (page 20). Then join the lines of blocks with single crochet seams in a zigzag formation. At each corner, work 1 sc into the 2-ch sps of both blocks, ss into end of previous seam, 1 sc into next pair of 2-ch sps. Darn in all yarn tails.

**BORDER**

Using size G (4 mm) hook, join 7<sup>th</sup> col. to 2-ch sp at any outer corner:

**Round 1:** 3 ch, 1 sc in same 2-ch sp, 1 sc in each sc; at inward corners, work 3 sc tog over [last 2-ch sp of one edge, side edge of previous seam, and first 2-ch sp of next edge]; at outer corners, work [1 sc, 2 ch, 1 sc] in 2-ch sp; at end of round, 1 ss in first of 3 ch.

**Round 2:** Ss into 2-ch sp, 1 sc in same ch sp, 1 sc in each sc; at inward corners, work 2 sc tog over



[sc before dec st, and sc after dec st]; at outer corners, work [1 sc, 2 ch, 1 sc] in 2-ch sp; at end of round, ss in first of 3 ch.

**Round 3:** As round 2.

Shaping on every sc round in this way makes the border slightly wavy, so the final round in reverse rope

stitch edging counteracts this effect, making the edge firmer:

**Final round:** Ss into 2-ch sp. 2 ch, work from left to right: \* skip 1 sc, 1 sc in next sc, 1 ch, \* rep from \* to \* all around, ending ss in first of 2 ch.

Fasten off Darn in yarn tails.

Block number	Round 1 (Yarn A)	Rounds 2 and 3 (Yarn B)	Rounds 4 and 5 (Yarn C)

## TO MAKE A LARGER THROW

Twenty-four blocks, arranged in four lines of six, make up the repeat for the pattern. This repeat section is indicated on the diagram.

**1** Make photocopies (or tracings) of the layout shown, cut out the sections, and arrange them as follows:

Repeat the 24 blocks to make the width required, adding line 1 (or lines 1, 2, and 3) at the right, to balance the outline. In the same way, repeat the 24 blocks to make the length required, adding extra blocks in sequence at the lower edge to make the outline symmetrical.

**2** Count the number of blocks required in all. Used in the order given, for every 24 blocks you will need approximately:

1st, 2nd, and 3rd colors: 100 g

4th, 5th, and 6th colors: 75 g

7th color: 100 g

To double-check the yarn amounts required, follow the guidelines on page 29—if in doubt, it is always best to buy extra yarn.

**3** Count the number of each block (1–6) required. Work all the blocks, then join and work border as given.

# FLOWER PURSES

These charming purses are easily made from two blocks of your choice, worked in thick crochet cotton. Add a lining to make sure your coins don't escape!

## MATERIALS

Size: Varies according to frame  
 Pearl cotton no. 5, 100 g ball = approx. 439 yd (400 m)  
 • Small amounts of cotton in colors as required  
 • Size B (2.25 mm) hook, or as required to obtain size  
 • 2½–4 in (6–10 cm) kisslock purse frame (semicircular or half-square) with pierced holes for sewing  
 • Tapestry needle small enough to fit through holes in frame, with eye large enough to take yarn (approx. size 24)

## ADAPTING SIZE

### To make a larger block

- Try again with a larger hook, or add an extra round of sc to the outer edge, as follows:
- For a square, work 1 sc in each st, and [1 sc, 2 ch, 1 sc] in same place at each corner, so increasing 8 sts.
- For a circle ending with 96 sts on the last round, work [1 sc in each of 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] 16 times, so increasing to 112 sts.

### To make a smaller block

- Try again with a smaller hook, or leave one or two outer rounds unworked.

## TO MAKE A PURSE

- 1 Choose a square or circular block to suit the frame. Avoid blocks with large holes. See the list of blocks used (right), to make the purses shown here.
- 2 Using size B (2.25 mm) hook, work one block of your choice. Test the size against the frame. The outer edge should not be stretched when sewn in place. See adapting size (below left) if you need to make your block larger or smaller.
- 3 When you are satisfied with the size, make another block to match. Matching the stitches, join the outer edges, on the right side of the work, with a single crochet seam (see page 20), leaving a gap to suit the frame. Dam in all the yarn tails.
- 4 Hold the free edge of one block in place so that the outer edge is just beneath the pierced edge of the frame, and use matching yarn to backstitch it in place through the pierced holes, spreading any fullness evenly.
- 5 Attach the free edge of the other block to the other side of the frame in the same way.



## ADD A LINING

To make your purse more practical, you can add a lining, as shown above.

- 1 Before sewing the purse to the frame, cut 2 pieces of lining fabric (lightweight silk or similar), each ¼ in (6 mm) larger all around than the block used.
- 2 Place these 2 pieces with wrong sides together and machine or backstitch ¼ in (6 mm) from the raw edge, leaving a gap to match the frame. Snip into the ¼ in (6 mm) seam allowance at each end of the stitching. If necessary, oversew the raw edges to prevent fraying.

- 3 Turn the lining wrong side out, and press ¼ in (6 mm) toward you, all around the unstitched edges on both sides.

- 4 Slip the lining inside the purse, and use matching sewing thread to slip stitch the folded edges of the lining to the open edges of the purse, just below the outer edge.

## BLOCKS USED

**Large circular purse:** Made using the Penny Flower Circle (block 72, page 125), with green for color A, lilac for color B, ecru for color C and fuchsia for color D. The blocks were joined with fuchsia.

**Large square purse:** Features the Ruffled Flower Square (block 32, page 85), using ecru for rounds 1, 3, and 4, lilac for round 2, fuchsia for rounds 5–7, and ecru for rounds 8 and 9, with an extra round of sc worked all around in fuchsia, and the joining seam in fuchsia.

**Small circular purse:** Worked from rounds 1–4 of the Coral Flower Circle (block 77, page 130), with round 1 in green, rounds 2 and 3 in yellow, and round 4 in lilac. The blocks are joined using green.

**Small square purse:** Uses rounds 1–6 of the Celtic Flower Square (block 21, page 74), with lilac for color A, ecru for color B, and green for color C. Green was used to join the blocks.



# DAISY CUSHION

This cushion is made with four Three Daisy Squares (block 19, page 72), using three different colors for the daisies. Adapt the pattern by substituting a different square block.

## MATERIALS

Size: 16 x 16 in (40 x 40 cm), plus edging  
DK or light worsted weight yarn, 50 g = approx. 125 yd (114 m)  
• 100 g (2 balls) of 1<sup>st</sup> color (white)  
• 250 g (5 balls) of 2<sup>nd</sup> color (wine red)  
• 25 g (half a ball) each of 3<sup>rd</sup> color (scarlet) and 4<sup>th</sup> color (copper)  
• Size G and E (4 and 3.5 mm) hooks  
• 5 buttons approx. 1 in (25 mm) diameter  
• Tapestry needle  
• Cushion pad 18 x 18 in (45 x 45 cm)

## GAUGE

Three Daisy Square (block 19, page 72) worked using size G (4 mm) hook measures 6½ x 6½ in (16.5 x 16.5 cm) square (after blocking).

## TO MAKE CUSHION

### Front

Using size G (4 mm) hook, make four Three Daisy Squares (block 19, page 72) using 1<sup>st</sup> col. (white) for the background square. Work the first daisy on each square in 3<sup>rd</sup> col. (scarlet), the second daisy in 2<sup>nd</sup> col. (wine red), and the third daisy in 4<sup>th</sup> col. (copper).

For a neat result, block the squares as on page 20 before seaming them together.

Join the squares in the arrangement shown in diagram (above right), using size E (3.5 mm) hook and single crochet seams (page 20) on right side of work.

### Front border

Using size G (4 mm) hook and 1<sup>st</sup> col. (white), with right side facing join yarn at one corner.

**Round 1:** 3 ch, 1 sc in same place, \* 26 sc in side edge of first square, 1 sc in seam, 1 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> dc of next square, 1 sc in each of 25 dc, [1 sc, 2 ch, 1 sc] in last dc, \* rep from \* to \* twice more, 53 sc along fourth edge as set, ss in first of 3 ch. 55 sc on each side. Fasten off 1<sup>st</sup> col. Join 2<sup>nd</sup> col. (wine red) in 2-ch sp.


**Round 2:** 3 ch, 1 sc in same place, \* 1 sc in each sc to next corner, [1 sc, 2 ch, 1 sc] in 2-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* twice more, 1 sc in each sc to corner; ss in first of 3 ch. 57 sc on each side.

**Round 3:** Ss into 2-ch sp, 5 ch, 2 dc in same ch sp, \* 1 dc in each sc to next corner; [2 dc, 2 ch, 2 dc] in 2-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* twice more, 1 dc in each sc to corner; 1 dc in first 2-ch sp, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 5 ch. 61 dc on each side.

**Round 4:** Ss into 2-ch sp, 5 ch, 2 dc in same ch sp, \* 1 dc in each dc to next corner; [2 dc, 2 ch, 2 dc] in 2-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* twice more, 1 dc in each dc to corner; 1 dc in first 2-ch sp, ss in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 5 ch. 65 dc on each side. Rep round 4 twice more. 73 dc on each side. Fasten off.

### Buttonhole panel

Cut six 10 in (25 cm) lengths of 2<sup>nd</sup> col. to use for buttonholes. Using size G (4 mm) hook and 2<sup>nd</sup> col. make 44 ch.



Far left: Back of cushion  
Left: Layout for cushion front (arrow indicates direction of working)

**Row 1:** 1 dc in 4<sup>th</sup> ch from hook, 1 dc in each ch to end. 42 sts.

**Row 2:** 3 ch, skip first dc, 1 dc in each dc, ending 1 dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch. Rep row 2 four more times.

**Buttonhole row:** Remove hook from working loop and join one short length to 4<sup>th</sup> dc, 3 ch, skip 4 dc, fasten off with ss in next dc. Pick up working loop onto hook, 3 ch, skip first dc, 1 dc in each of 2 dc, 1 dc in dc to which short length was joined, 2 dc tog over [same dc and into 3-ch sp], 2 dc into 3-ch sp, 2 dc tog over [same 3-ch sp and next dc], 1 dc in same dc as last insertion, 1 dc in each dc ending 1 dc in 3<sup>rd</sup> of 3 ch. Work row 2 five times in all. Rep last 6 rows four more times. 36 rows in all. Fasten off.

### Panel edging

With right side facing, use size E (3.5 mm) hook to join 2<sup>nd</sup> col. to lower corner of right side edge next to buttonholes, 1 ch, 2 sc in side edge of each row to top corner. Fasten off.

### Button panel

Work to match buttonhole panel, omitting buttonholes and working edging on left side edge.

## TO MAKE UP

Lap the buttonhole panel over the button panel by 11 sts, so making the top and bottom edges 73 sts wide, and pin or baste in place.

**Joining round:** Place the front and back with wrong sides together

and use size E (3.5 mm) hook to join 2<sup>nd</sup> col. to 2-ch sp at corner of front, at right of top edge of back panels, 1 ch, 1 sc in each dc of front, together with corresponding dc of back, to overlap; at overlap, work 1 sc in each dc of front together with corresponding dc of buttonhole panel only, continue to corner; at corner, work 1 sc in 2-ch sp of front together with 1 sc into corner of back; work down side edge in same way, placing 2 sc in side edge of every row of back; work along lower edge in same way as top edge, and up second side edge in same way as first side edge, ss into first ch.

**Loopy border:** 7 ch, \* 1 sc in next sc, 6 ch, \* rep from \* to \* all around, ending ss in first of 7 ch. Fasten off.

### Optional extra daisy

Using size G (4 mm) hook and 4<sup>th</sup> col. make 6 ch, join into a ring with ss in first ch.

**Round 1:** 1 ch, 11 sc into ring, ss in first ch. 12 sts.

**Round 2:** As round 2 of daisy (page 72).

Sew at the center of the cushion.

## TO FINISH

Darn in all the yarn tails. Press according to instructions on yarn bands, omitting daisies. Sew on buttons to match buttonholes.



# ROSE SCARF

This scarf is an easy project made using the Granny Rose Triangle (block 4, page 51) worked in aran yarn. A single line of blocks will make an adult-sized scarf.

## MATERIALS

Size: approx. 8 x 60 in (20 x 152 cm)  
Aran weight wool/mohair mix, 50 g = approx 153 yd (140 m)

- 150 g (3 balls) of 1<sup>st</sup> col. (peacock)
- 50 g (1 ball) each of 2<sup>nd</sup> col. B (old gold), 3<sup>rd</sup> col. (pink), and 4<sup>th</sup> col. (copper)
- Size H and I (5 and 5.5 mm) hooks
- Tapestry needle

## GAUGE

Granny Rose Triangle (block 4, page 51) worked using size I (5.5 mm) hook measures 7½ in (19 cm) on each side.

## TO MAKE SCARF

### First block

Using size I (5.5 mm) hook, work Granny Rose Triangle (block 4, page 51), using 2<sup>nd</sup> col. for round 1, 3<sup>rd</sup> col. for rounds 2 and 3, and 1<sup>st</sup> col. for rounds 4–7.

### Second block

Work as first block, but using 4<sup>th</sup> col. for rounds 2 and 3. Do not fasten off at end of round 7.

### Join to previous block

Join with a single crochet seam (page 20) on right side of work as follows:

Ss into 2-ch sp, 1 ch, 1 sc inserting hook through same ch sp, and through corresponding 2-ch sp of previous block (from behind), [1 sc in each pair of corresponding sc] 25 times, 2 sc in corresponding 2-ch sps. Fasten off.

### Third block

Work in colors as first block, joining to second block as above, to make arrangement shown in diagram 1.

Repeat second and third blocks 5 more times 13 blocks in all.

## BORDER

Using size H (5 mm) hook, join 1<sup>st</sup> col. to 2-ch sp at outer corner of thirteenth block:

**Round 1:** 6 ch, 1 sc in same 2-ch sp, \* 5 ch, skip 2 sc, 1 sc in next sc, [5 ch, skip 4 sc, 1 sc in next sc] 4 times, 5 ch, skip 2 sc, \*\* 1 sc in 2-ch sp, 5 ch, skip [1 seam, 2-ch sp

and next seam], 1 sc in 2-ch sp, \* rep from \* to \* to last block, work once from \* to \*\* to outer corner, [1 sc, 5 ch, 1 sc] in 2-ch sp, work once from \* to \*\*, 1 sc in next 2-ch sp, 5 ch, skip 1 seam, 1 sc in next 2-ch sp, rep from \* to \* to last 2 blocks, work once from \* to \*\*, 1 sc in next 2-ch sp, 5 ch, skip 1 seam, 1 sc in next 2-ch sp, work once from \* to \*\*, ss in first of 6 ch.

**Round 2:** Ss into 5-ch sp, 1 ch, [2 sc, 3 ch, 3 sc] in same 5-ch sp, [3 sc, 3 ch, 3 sc] in each 5-ch sp all around, ending ss in first ch of round. Fasten off.

## TO FINISH

Darn in all the yarn tails neatly. Press according to instructions on yarn bands



## TIPS

- You can choose a different block. Squares or diamonds can also be used to make a long scarf (see diagram 2).
- When choosing a block, bear in mind the appearance of the wrong side.
- The yarn weight and hook size will determine the finished size. Blocks in this book, worked in aran or bulky yarn (with a suitable hook, as page 10) will make a scarf approx. 7–9 in (18–23 cm) wide.
- For a long scarf, a good rule of thumb is to make the length approximately equal to the height of the wearer.


